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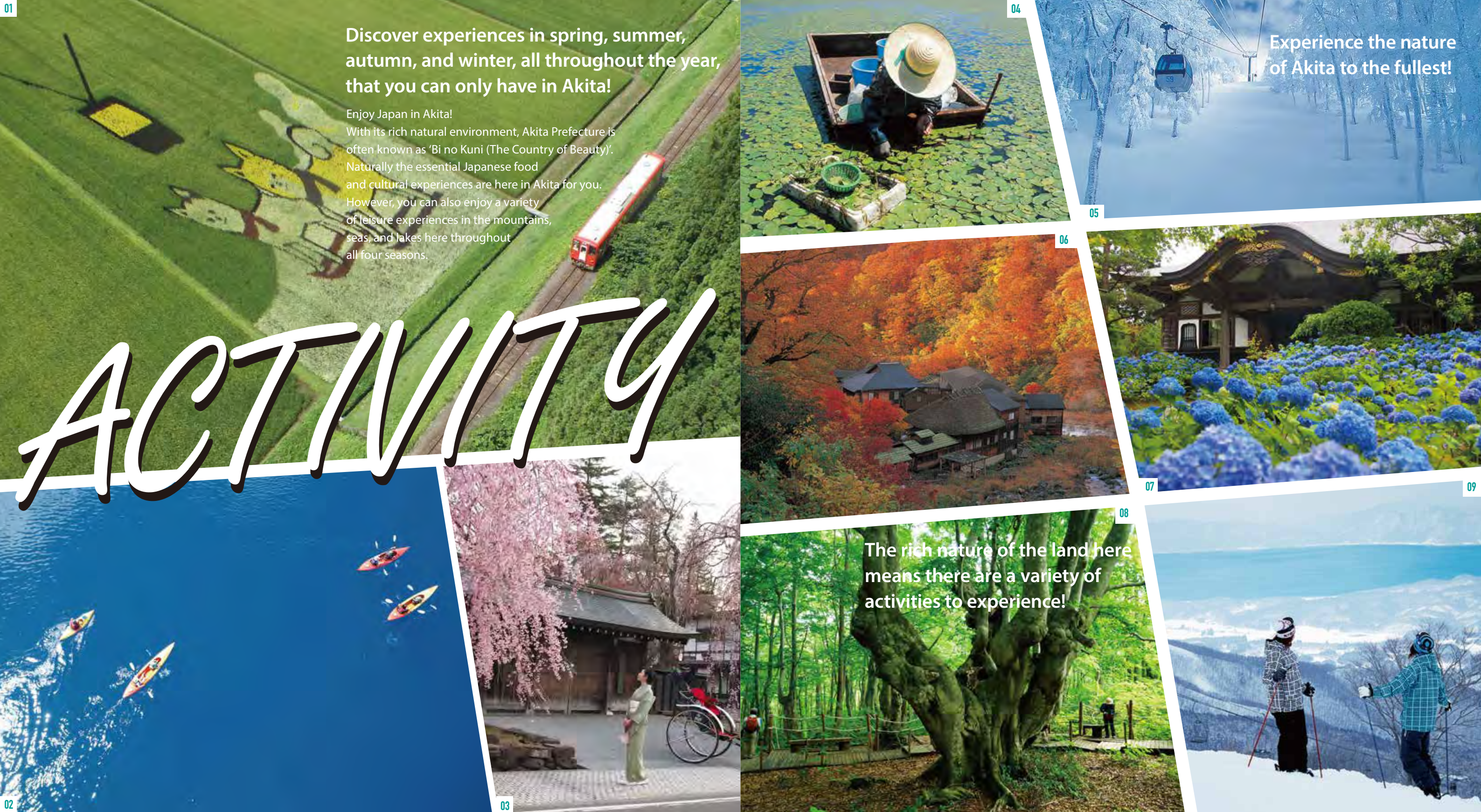

With its rich natural environment, Akita Prefecture is often known as 'Bi no Kuni (The Country of Beauty)'. Naturally the essential Japanese food and cultural experiences are here in Akita for you. However, you can also enjoy a variety of leisure experiences in the mountains, seas, and lakes here throughout all four seasons.

A giant canvas! Tambo Art

Tambo art uses rice paddies as a canvas to paint giant pictures with different colored rice plants.

The deepest lake in Japan! Lake Tazawa Kayaking Experience

Lake Tazawa is the deepest lake in Japan with a depth of 423.4m. You will love its beautiful blueness that spreads out and fills your field of vision.

Feel the history! Kakunodate Bukeyashiki Street

This sightseeing spot, where the townscape gives you a real sense of the Edo era, attracts 2,000,000 visitors annually. You can try on a kimono and ride rickshaws here.

Enjoy the unique flavor and texture of the luxury food junsai (water shield). This is the only place you can experience maneuvering a small boat and carefully picking these plants one by one!

Mt. Moriyoshi is known as one of the hundred best mountains for wild flowers, and also its snow-covered tree scenery of winter.

This is Japan's greatest national firework competition, where Japan's best pyrotechnicians gather.

This festival of giant castle lanterns was revived in the summer of 2013 after a gap of over a century. The two impressive giant lanterns are paraded down the street of Noshiro accompanied by taiko drums and a traditional hayashi orchestra.

Namahage

What are the Namahage?

These are divine joy-bringing spirits that visit the houses of the Oga District on the night of 31st December to caution against idleness. They also bear the blessings of sound health and good harvests from the seas and mountains. They are registered as a UNESCO intangible cultural heritage.

Where can I meet the Namahage?

Namahage Museum

You can see all the Namahage in this museum. The over 150 Namahage masks that are actually in use make an incredible sight here! There is also an excellent video images area and souvenir area here.



Oga Shinzan Folklore Museum

You can experience Namahage performances at Oga Shinzan Folklore Museum, which is located next to the Namahage-Museum.

Business hours, holidays, and entrance fees vary depending on the season so please check the Website.

Namahage Sedo Festival

This is a tourist event that combines a Shinzan Shrine of Shinzan Shrine with the Namahage. It's a mystical and soul-stirring winter festival in the snow where the Namahage perform a wild dance.

Held: The 2nd Friday, Saturday, and Sunday in February annually

Nyuto Hot Spring Village

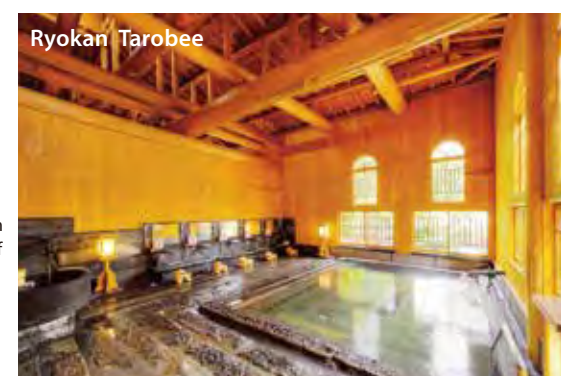

Gono Line (Resort Shirakami)

This local line that connects Aomori Prefecture with Higashi Noshiro in Akita Prefecture measures 147.2km in length. As the view from the train windows are beautiful, it's popular across Japan as a train line people want to experience riding on at least once.

Yuri Kogen Railway

It measures 23km in length and connects 12 stations around the base of Mt. Chokai. One of its attractions is the various events they hold inside the train, which vary by season.

This hot spring accommodation nestles quietly in the valley upstream of the river. It is the most secluded hot spring where you can enjoy gray-white colored and thick hot spring water.

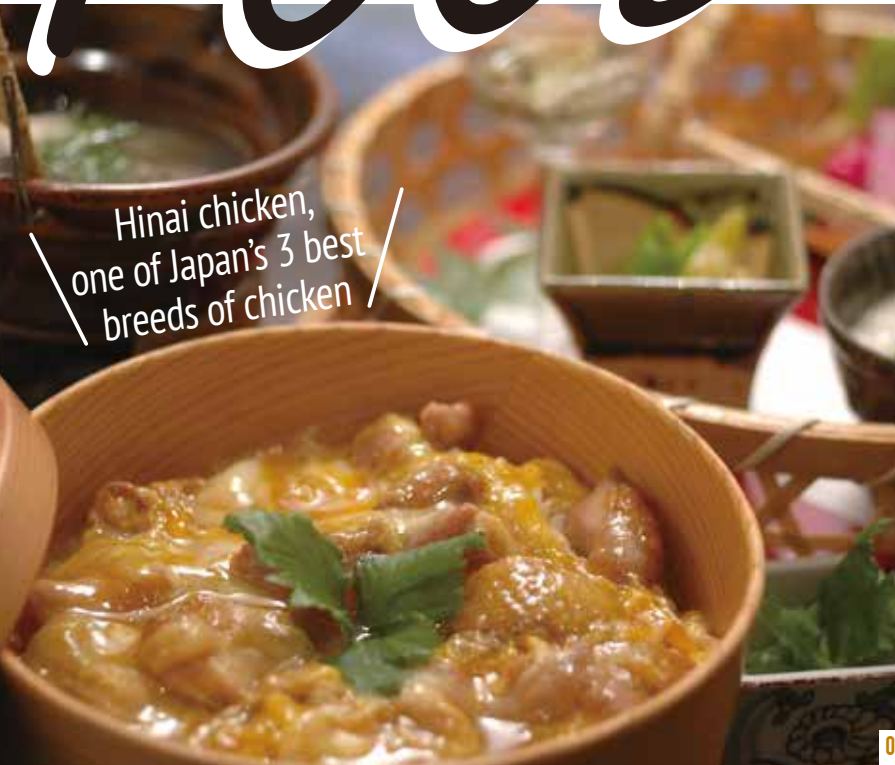

01 Hinai Chicken Oyako-Don

Hinai chicken is one of the three best breeds of chicken in Japan. Oyako-don made with Hinai chicken and eggs which are raised under strict standards has an exquisite taste.

02 Ishiyaki Hot Stone Cooking

After putting some Oga sea bream or seaweed in a wooden tub, it is cooked by the sizzling stone placed inside. It's a hearty fisherman's style of cooking to enjoy fresh seafood.

03 Inaniwa Udon Noodles

These are one of the three best udon noodles of Japan. They have a distinctive smooth texture, strong chewiness and an elegant flavor. They can be enjoyed hot or cold.

04 Kiritampo Nabe

This is made by boiling Hinai chicken and vegetables together with Kiritampo, which are made by pounding cooked rice, wrapping this rice around cedar skewers and then toasting it. Kiritampo nabe is the prime representative of Akita's regional dishes.

Odate Magewappa

These are made by bending sheets of Akita cedar wood. The great aroma of Akita cedar and the beautiful wood grain and natural color tone enhance the deliciousness of the food.

Kawatsura Lacquerware

This is a traditional handicraft with an 800 year history. These lacquerware products, including owan wooden bowls and smaller kobachi bowls, are both beautiful and strong.

Kabazaiku

These wood products are made using the bark of cherry trees. They are a popular handicraft.

Akita Confectionery

There are many kinds of confectionery in Akita long traditions. Recently confectioneries with the popular Akita dog as a motif are on sale, too.

Japanese Sake

Japanese sake in Akita is made with excellent sake rice and pristine water. The taste of real Akita sake has fans throughout the world.

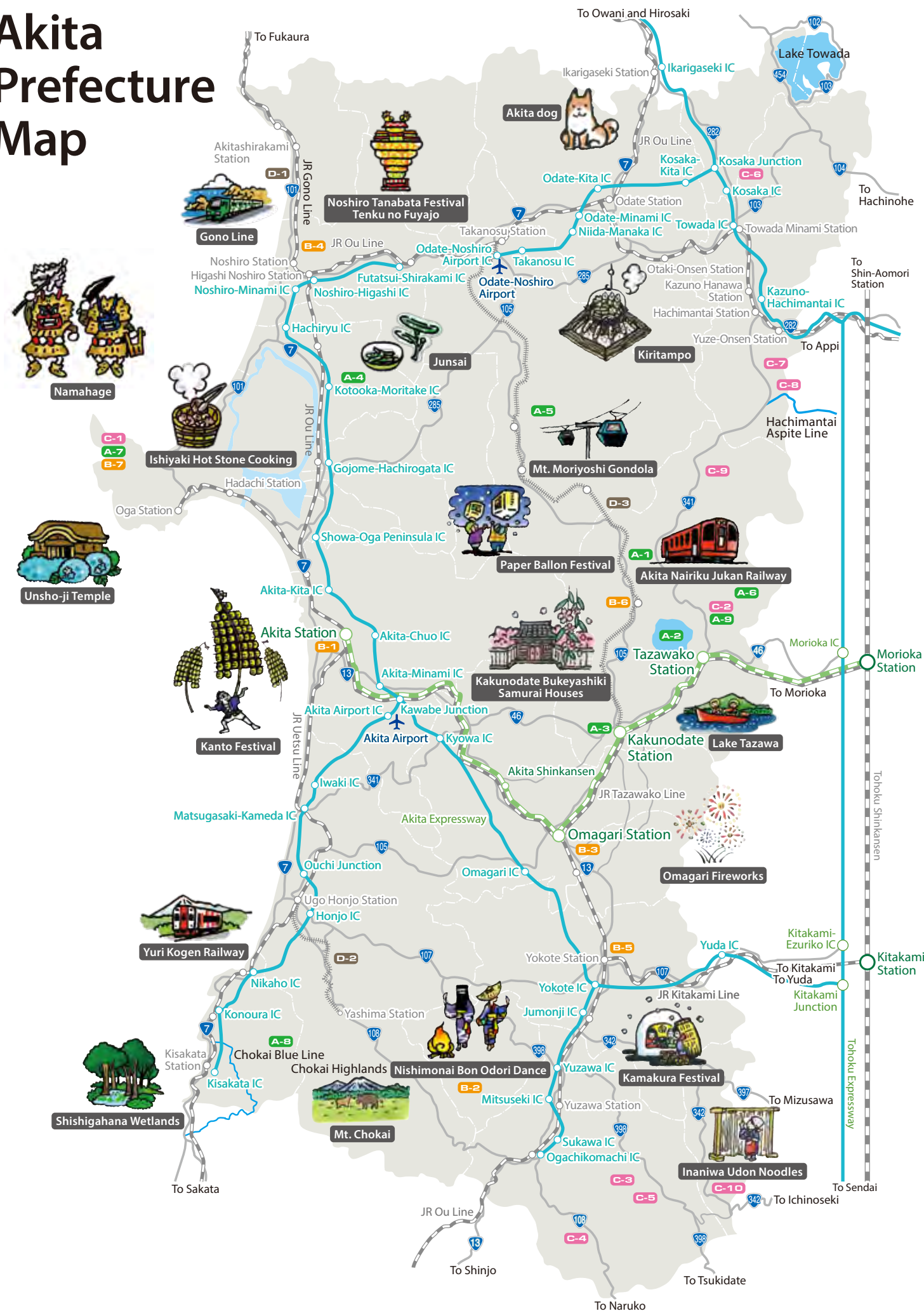

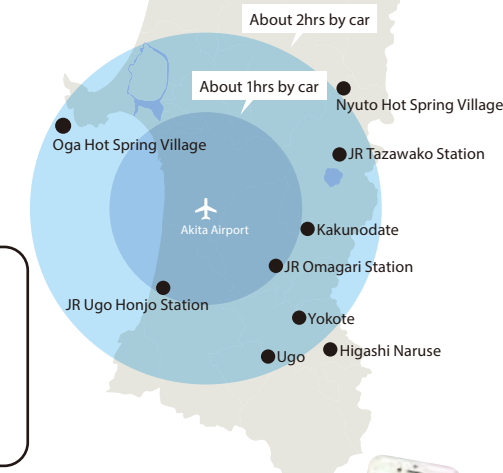
